- **August 31** "What's Eating Gilbert Grape" (1993; PG-13) by Lasse Hallstrom; 118 min. Discussion led by Rebecca Ayraud. *(preceded by opening reception at War Memorial Building at 5:30 PM)*
- **September 14** "In the Hills and Hollows" (2016; not rated) by Keely Kernan; 77 min. Presented in collaboration with the American Conservation Film Festival (ACFF).
- **September 21** "The Deer Hunter" (1978; R) by Michael Cimino; 3 hours and 3 min. Presented in conjunction with Shepherd University's Appalachian Heritage Writer-in-Residence program. *In lieu of a post-film discussion, please consider attending Dr. James Broomall's talk "Soldiers' Tales from the Civil War: Stories of Home and the Trauma of War" in Reynolds Hall at 5:30.*
- **October 5** "The Umbrellas of Cherbourg" (1964; not rated) by Jacques Demy, in French and English; 91 min. Discussion led by Mary Stanley.
- **October 26** "Bride of Frankenstein" (1935; not rated) by James Whale; 75 min. Presented as a collaboration with Shepherd University's Department of English and Modern Languages in celebration of the 200th anniversary of Mary Shelley's *Frankenstein*. Discussion led by Dr. James Pate.
- **November 16** "The Station Agent" (2003; R) by Tom McCarthy, in English and Spanish; 89 min. Discussion led by Winnie Bernat.
